- ◇ Shepherd's Refuge – Selah Ministries is a non-profit, 501 (c) 3 organization.
- ◇ Financial support is greatly appreciated through either a one-time gift or possibly monthly donations.
- ◇ Consider a monetary gift to the ministry in-lieu of a material gift for a loved one and we will be happy to send them a hand written note of recognition.
- ◇ Talk to your accountant about maximizing your tax deductions for the end of 2005.

Money received in the General Fund is put to the following use:

- ⇒ Accommodation of guests, food, housing, laundry, clean-up
- ⇒ Maintenance of facility
- ⇒ Administration (less than 3% of donations)
- ⇒ Land purchase account
- ⇒ Construction account

During the last 3 months, for example, your donations have enabled several pastors and church leaders to come seek solitude and

restoration, staying anywhere from one to ten days. A group of church leaders from various denominations in the Atlanta area met for a day at Shepherd's Refuge and prayed for guidance in working together next year, and yet another inter-denominational prayer group spent a day planning their upcoming year events. Most of the funds received however have been set aside for the land purchase and construction of the cabins since these projects will only be started once sufficient funds are available in order to avoid debt.

Some of you have partnered with us in prayer, some in physical work on the land and many have joined with a financial gift.

What to do about Stress

The Lecturer, when explaining stress management to an audience, raised a glass of water and asked "How heavy is this glass of water? "

"Because I'd been operating in my own strength for months, I was physically, emotionally and spiritually exhausted. My spiritual eyesight had grown dim and my hearing dull. Pride had sprung up in my heart like a choking weed. Instead of obeying God's voice, I reasoned with human logic and based my decisions on my own wisdom." "Ministry had become an idol. Working for God had taken the place of loving God."

"Because of disobedience and disrespect for the Lord, my wife and my co-workers, I went to prison for a second time. The Lord saw I was exhausted in the ministry, so He graciously allowed me to rest in Him behind bars for a while and learn about inner spiritual life. If you are a servant of the Lord, let me encourage you to please, please, humbly watch that you don't slip into the same error I did. The Lord God jealously desires us for Himself. He is the lover of our souls. If we ever put anything before our relationship with Jesus – even our work for Jesus – then we will be ensnared. If you are burned out, stop! Rest! Your lamp needs a constant infilling of the Lord's oil or your light will be snuffed out."

Did you know?

- That every fifth person in a leadership position is headed for burn-out?
- That the number of burn-out victims is on the increase.

Reasons for stress (resulting in possible burn-out):

- Discrepancy between job expectations and reality of work place environment.
- Excessive work load (not always recognized as such!)
- Tasks that are beyond control.
- Achievements are not recognized.
- Team spirit is missing, each one looks out for themselves.
- Fear of failure.
- Individual values and visions are neglected.
