Progress Report

- Here is the follow up story on the well: the first well reached 700 feet and had sufficient water for the main house and at least for the first two cabins. However when the pump was installed they found out that the bottom 300 feet had collapsed. The drilling company was very generous and offered to try at another site only to find out that the 900-foot well produced less than a gallon per minute, not enough to even supply the main house. The decision was made to use the original well, which was now 400 feet and still produced enough water for both the main house and the cabins as long as we install some holding tanks. Praise the Lord for providing not only the Living Water but also the physical water!
- ◆ The first building, which is part of Shepherd's Refuge, has been constructed! The well house serves both the main house (ground breaking for it should happen in December!) and the cabins (ground breaking as soon as funds are available!).
- A Bible Study Group came to help with cleaning up the orchard and cutting firewood. What a blessing this time of hard work was and what sweet fellowship we all enjoyed! A

- big THANK YOU to all who participated!
- Many visitors have come to see the land and can better understand our vision for Shepherd's Refuge. All agree that the beauty of the land needs to be preserved and how the ministry will accomplish this.
- More pastors have spent time at the cabin and found much needed rest.
 Based on their comments, we are looking forward to serving many more in the very near future!
- We can also report some progress regarding new contacts with foundations. Please continue to pray that the right partners can be brought on board. We realize that the initial investment to get the land and first cabin funded will establish the foundation for further growth. This achievement will also encourage others to come on board with their support. Please join us in prayer for this to happen. The need is there and God is ready to use willing servants to supply what is required.
- Talking about the need for such a ministry! We have learned of other ministries that are providing a very structured curriculum for pastors. Their guests are quite often close to

a breaking point that must be overcome by the security of discipline and counseling. Shepherd's Refuge addresses this need in a different manner. We believe it is important to catch them before they reach a point of desperation, before the pastor's ministry, family and church are impacted. We want to keep pastors healthy and provide opportunities for "preventative maintenance" by immersing them with love, serving their needs and providing an atmosphere filled with God's presence and the beauty of His creation!

A new year is just around the corner. Using pencil (so that the Lord can use the eraser to make changes!) we plan to:

- Proceed with the construction of the main house. (And move into it)
- Pursue partnerships with individuals, corporations and foundations.
- Start construction of the cabins.
- Serve those who serve and minister in leadership of the church community.
