SHALOM CABIN UPDATE

All of us have seen the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic upon our country and the world. Ministries around the world have been carefully navigating through these challenging times and Shepherds Refuge is no exception. We have been raising funds for the construction of our next cabin and were prepared to begin the construction process when suddenly Covid-19 brought those efforts to a halt.

Stewardship of the resources that we have been provided is an important part of our ministry. So, we have hit the pause button on construction of the next cabin until prices stabilize within the construction industry. A recent article posted on the website for the NAHB (National Association of Home Builders) stated the following: "Lumber prices have skyrocketed more than 180% since last spring. This price spike has caused the price of an average new single-family home to increase by more than \$24,000 since April 17, 2020. NAHB is working with government officials to develop solutions to these sharp price increases which threaten housing affordability across the nation. Slowdowns in mining, transportation and manufacturing have affected industries and products across the country. As the supply channels tighten, and inventories are depleted, materials are costing more for the manufacturers and prices are going to increase for consumers. COVID-19 restrictions have hampering sawmills, while quarantined Americans pursued home renovations or do-ityourself projects thus increasing the demand for materials. Matters have been made worse by low interest rates and tight existing home inventory which has caused new home builders to ramp up production. The demand for new homes is so high that even during an economic crisis we hit a 14-year high in new housing starts in December.

So what are we going to do? While we are focusing on infrastructure and site work in preparation for construction of the next cabin, we are also using this time wisely to conduct site planning for future additional cabins, thus reducing our overall expenses. Stewardship of the resources provided by our partners is essential. Facing the challenges of this season means careful and thoughtful consideration of how to effectively achieve our objective.

We are grateful for all that you have done and that you continue to stand with us as we move forward advancing the work of supporting pastors and ministry leadership.
